i	Catchment Area Treatment Plan has been proposed should be completed in three years.	 The previous project proponent had deposited Rs. Two Crore to Forest Environment & Wildlife Management Department, Government of Sikkim. The Original CAT Plan provision in the Environment Management Plan was 206.4 lakh during the year 2007-08. The estimated provision was scheduled for four years for implementation of engineering and bioengineering works and three years of maintenance cost. Govt. of Sikkim vide letter no. 1225/GOS/FEWMD dated 28.03.12 has revised the amount of CAT Plan to Rs. 346.59 lakhs as per the revised labour wages and escalation in cost of other construction material. CAT works are being executed by Land Use & Environment Division, South Sikkim and West Sikkim. Matter is being pursued to get the latest progress report. 	
ii	If a Wildlife and/or National Parks exist with 10 Km from the radius of the project site, clearance under the Wildlife (Protection) Act., 1972 should be obtained. vi	Consolidation and Compilation of the muck should be carried-out in the muck dump sites and the dump sites should be above high flood level. Suitable retaining walls are constructed to develop terraces so as to support the muck on vertical slope and for optimum space utilization. The loose muck should be compacted layer wise. The muck disposal area will be developed in a series of terraces of Boulder crate wall and masonry wall to protect the area/muck from flood water during monsoon.	All the dumping areas located in both Forest and Private land are approved by Government of Sikkim. Detailed standard Engineering Specifications have been adopted by way of construction of Gabion walls. The work is being done strictly as per the area requirement for optimum disposal of muck. The crate walls constructed at all the dumping sites are well above the high flood level to prevent the area/muck from flood water during monsoon. Terrace construction/bench development at dumping area nos. 1, 6 & 7 is completed by erstwhile JPCL (previous project proponent). A suitable terrace has been constructed for laying the impervious fertile soil for necessary plantation work.
vii	The dam will act as a barrier to the free movement of Migratory fish species. A hatchery should be developed for stocking, as proposed in the Environment Management Plan.	For the implementation of Fish Management Plan, JPCL had consulted with the Central Inland Cold water Fisheries Research Institute, Bhimtal, Uttrakhand for providing necessary consultancy services regarding the implementation of Fish Management plan. The response from their end is awaited. In addition, Fisheries Department, Government of Sikkim has also been approached for necessary advice from their end.
