## **Status of other Environment Management Plans:**

- i. Fisheries Development: For fisheries development a provision of Rs.94.70 Lac was made under EMP. Thereafter, the plan was revised by Fisheries Department, Govt. of J&K, to Rs.180 lakhs. NHPC has released an amount of Rs.180 lakhs to Fishery Deptt. The Fishery Department has acquired 27 Kanal 04 marla of Govt. land adjacent to the existing fish farm in Damsana Purtichery village on lease for 40 years for construction of fish farm for the project. Fund utilization certificate for Rs.179.99 lakhs has been received till August 2019 from Fishery Dept. Leh.
- **ii. Sewage and Solid waste disposal:** Septic tanks with soak pits have been provided in all colonies. Dustbins have been provided in colonies/camps and manpower have been engaged for collection and safe disposal of solid waste. STPs at Residential/ Office and Power House Sites are expected to be commissioned in FY 2023-24.
- **Afforestation:** For afforestation works around the project area an expenditure of Rs. 23.65 lakhs has been utilized against allocated cost of Rs. 28.01 lakhs. Further, approx. 7.57 ha barren land in the vicinity of the Project area was planted with fruit bearing trees under afforestation scheme. Voluntary plantation are also conducted from time to time at the Power Station.

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
