		b. In the 2nd Phase, an amount Rs. 837.75 lakhs was sanctioned for balance 71 Nos. of PAFs. Out of which a total of Rs. 744.98 lakh was disbursed to 68 PAF's (62 PAF's received full amount while 6 PAF's received 50% amount) till date as per consent of District Administration and GTA. The balance 50% amount of compensation will be disbursed to 6 nos. of PAFs subject to dismantling of their home shed. 03 nos. of PAFs have refused to accept the compensation determined by committee for which notices have been issued to them.

		 As such, out of 84 nos. of PAFs, 73 have received full compensation, 6 have received 50 % compensation while 5 have denied the compensation.

An amount of Rs. 914.29 lakh was released by TLD-III power station for implementation of CAT plan.
