Assistant Director vide letter dated 25.09.23 and 27.10.23 requested for release of balance fund for DPR formulation and execution of project.

vi Fishery development plan as proposed should be implemented in consultation with the State Fishery Department.

An amount of Rs. 57.33 lakhs was earmarked for Fisheries Development Plan in the EMP report. An amount of Rs. 25 lakh was released to Fisheries Dept., Govt. of J&K in Jan. 2011 for works related to development of Fish farm at Gurez and Fisheries Dept. has submit the utilization certificate for Rs. 24.48 lakh. J&K State Fisheries Deptt. vide letter dated 10.02.2014 had submitted revised fishery development plan to Rs. 630.78 lakh, for which Administrative Approval was accorded by JK Govt. vide Order dated 23.08.2017.

A meeting was held with Director (Fisheries) & other officials of Deptt. of Fisheries on 13.10.2017 for the finalization of the schedule of work and codal formalities to execute the work, wherein it was decided that balance amount of Rs. 605.78 lakh shall be released in four quarterly installments subject to submission of utilization certificate. In view of above, an amount of Rs. 150 lakhs was released by NHPC on 09.02.2018 to Director, Fisheries Govt. of J&K for executing various work components as per the approved plan. Assistant Director Fisheries, Bandipora vide letter dated 17.04.2019 had submitted utilization certificate for Rs. 150.00 lakhs. The site visit was conducted on 04.03.2020 along with Executive Engineer (R&B) Govt. of J&K. The fisheries department has completed the works pertaining to Fisheries development at Bandipora.

In order to take up the remaining fisheries works an amount of Rs. 230 lakhs has been released to Director Fisheries on 19.02.2021. Total amount of Rs 505.00 lakh released to Director, Fisheries, Govt of J&K and Rs 287.89 lakh stands utilized.

The activities undertaken are as under:

- Construction of Survey Hut at Gurez- completed
- Purchase of Feed mill at Shokbaba- completed
- Chain link fencing for pelleted trout feed millcompleted
- Construction of 2 pairs of American type raceways at Shokbaba- completed
- Laying of water pipeline- completed
- Construction of farm hut at Bandipora completed.
- Construction of 4 nos. American type raceways- in progress.

Accordingly, Project Officer (CAT) floated tenders on 14.08.2020 informed NHPC that bidder for executing work in Gurez and Muck disposal site, Bandipora has been finalized. As on 03.01.2024, total Rs. 1439.53 lakhs released to DFO CAT Bandipora and Rs. 1295.00 stands utilized. At TBM site approx. 98% work is completed and at Kanzalwan site work has been completed.

Other environment safeguard measures:

1. Creation of Green Belt Development around Reservoir

Forest Department has submitted proposal for execution of work of Creation of Green Belt Development around Reservoir vide letter dated 14.09.2019. Administrative Approval for execution of work was accorded by the Competent Authority on 30.10.2019. As per the requisition submitted by PO, CAT, an installment of Rs 25 Lakhs plus GST was released for the execution of the work.

2. Solid Waste Disposal

Project is commissioned. Sewage Treatment Plant of 20 kl/day capacity was installed at Project Township for the treatment of domestic sewage. Further, this STP is being upgraded and there is a proposal of installing three STPs at Project Campus with 02 Nos. with 100KLD and one number with 50KLD capacity. The proposal is at tendering stage. A system for collection and disposal of domestic solid waste has been developed wherein waste is being collected and disposed at designated disposal site through Municipal Committee, Bandipora.

3. Monitoring of ambient air, water quality and noise level

Monitoring of ambient air, water quality and noise level is being taken up.
