	Reasons for delay, if the project is yet to be started	The project was started by Jal Power Corporation Limited in July 2008. However, the construction of the project was stuck up since November 2013 due to financial crisis. Subsequently the corporate creditors invoked CIRP through NCLT. Subsequent to approval of Resolution Plan by Hon'ble National Company Law Tribunal (NCLT), NHPC Ltd. has acquired the JPCL as a going concern on 31.03.2021. Now, the balance construction works of Rangit-IV H.E. Project is being carried out by Jal Power Corporation Limited (A wholly Owned Subsidiary of NHPC Ltd.)
	Details of the site visits: a) By Monitoring Committee	(a) A Monitoring Committee was constituted by Additional Director (IA), MoEF, New Delhi vide letter dated 14.01.2009 and four meetings had been conducted. Last meeting was held on 30 th January 2013. However, due to stoppage/stuck up of the project further monitoring committee meetings could not be conducted by the then Project Proponent. - Environment Clearance (EC) letter dated 16.05.2007 was issued to M/S JPCL(the previous Project Proponent) which had submitted the last six monthly report to MOEF&CC vide letter dated JPCL:JT:ADMN:2014 Dated 12.01.2015 addressed to MOEF, Shillong.
- NHPC has taken over the M/s JPCL on 31.03.2023. Consequent upon the taking over of M/s JPCL by NHPC, MOEF&CC's letter dated 23.02.2022 clarified that the conditions stipulated in EC shall now be complied by M/s JPCL (a wholly owned subsidiary of NHPC Ltd.).
- Accordingly, M/s JPCL (a wholly owned subsidiary of NHPC Ltd.) has started submission of six monthly report vide letter dated 31.05.2022(ending March, 2022). The six monthly report also contains the data/information related to previous compliance of EC as reported by the then project proponent (M/s JPCL) in the last six monthly report dated 12.01.2015 submitted to the ministry.

The previous project proponent had deposited Rs. Two Crore to Forest Environment & Wildlife Management Department, Government of Sikkim. The Original CAT plan provision in the Environment Management Plan was Rs206.4 lakh during the year 2007-08. The estimated provision was scheduled for four years for implementation of engineering and bioengineering works and three years of maintenance cost. Govt. of Sikkim vide letter no. 1225/GOS/FEWMD dated 28.03.12 had revised the amount of CAT plan to Rs. 346.59 lakhs (three crore forty six lakhs and fifty nine thousand) as per the revised labour wages and escalation in cost of other construction material. CAT works are being executed by Land Use & Environment Division, South Sikkim and West Sikkim. Matter is being pursued to get the latest progress report.
