i.	9 families of the 2 villages of Geil Khola & 29th Mile, comprising total 51 persons will be affected. Out of total, 31 persons are fully affected and 19 persons partially affected. The affected families should be rehabilitated as per R & R plan proposed & submitted this ministry.	As per EIA&EMP Report, total 36 nos. of Project Affected Families (PAFs) got affected due to formation of reservoir. Out of which 27 families were losing land and 9 families losing their homestead land & house and all the 36 nos. of PAFs were compensated. Further, in view of impoundment of the reservoir and operation of Project, a compensation Committee was constituted by the Gorkha Territorial Administration (GTA) vide memo dated 20.02.2014 for families residing along the rim of reservoir. The Committee identified total 84 nos. PAFs located across three villages viz. 29th Mile, Geil Khola and Teesta Bazar along rim of reservoir on right bank of river Teesta. Details of Compensation are as below: a. In the 1 st phase, an amount of Rs. 106.65 lakhs was sanctioned for 13 nos. of PAFs at 29 th Mile. Out of which a total of Rs. 93.44 lakh disbursed to 11 PAFs as per consent of District
		Administration and GTA, whereas 02 PAF refused to accept the compensation determined by the committee. b. In the 2nd Phase, an amount Rs. 837.75 lakhs was sanctioned for balance 71 Nos. of PAFs. Out of which a total of Rs. 744.98 lakh disbursed to 68 PAF's (62 PAF's received full amount while 6 PAF's received 50% amount) till date as per consent of District Administration and GTA. The balance 50% amount of compensation will be disbursed to 6 nos. of PAFs subject to dismantling of their home shed. 03 nos. of PAFs have refused to accept the compensation determined by committee for which notices have been issued to them. • As such, out of 84 nos. of PAFs, 73 have received full compensation, 6 have received 50% compensation while 5 have denied the compensation.

ii.	Catchment Area Treatment Plan: The area of 12022.43 ha identified as very highly degraded and highly degraded catchment area should be completed in five years.	An amount of Rs. 914.29 lakh was released by TLD-III power station for implementation of CAT plan out of which Rs. 341.00 deposited to the Govt. of West Bengal and Rs.573.29 deposited to the Govt. of Sikkim. Rs. 305.98 lakh has been utilized under CAT plan by the Forest Deptt. of West Bengal whereas Rs. 412.82 lakh has been utilized under CAT plan by the Forest Deptt. of Sikkim. As such, total fund of Rs. 718.8 lakh has been utilized by West Bengal and Sikkim Forest Departments for the work till date.
		Various engineering measures such as sausage walls, crate walls, catch water drains, stepped drains, stone masonry plum wall, palisade wall, belly benching, etc. have been carried-out by the concerned State Forest Dept. under CAT Plan. Plantation and other biological activities have also being undertaken under biological measures as per the approved CAT working plan. Project is continuously pursuing with the State Forest Deptt. for early completion of the balance CAT works.
iii	Biodiversity Conservation Plan: the proposed Orchidarium near the barrage should include a provision for conservation of rare orchids that are likely to get submerged. Conservation of rare orchids as proposed should be carried out in consultation with the Department of Forest, Govt. of West Bengal and North Bengal University.	An Orchidarium and Arboretum has been established through Darjeeling Forest Division over an area of 06 ha forest land at Reang Block near TLD-IIIPS. Wild orchids were collected from the surrounding areas and transferred into Orchidarium for conservation in consultation with the Forest Deptt. and North Bengal University. An amount of Rs. 58.45 was deposited on behalf of both TLD-III&IV to West Bengal Forest Department. Out of which Rs. 30 lakh has been utilized by Darjeeling Forest Division till date. Project is continuously pursuing with the State Forest Department for early completion of the balance works.
