Environmental & Other Safeguard Measures

- 1. Resettlement & Rehabilitation: The Govt. of J&K had accorded approval to R&R plan with financial implication of Rs.149 lakh and against which an amount of Rs.100 lakh was deposited with Collector Land Acquisition (CLA), out of which Rs. 80.08 Lacs was disbursed to 91 No. PAFs falling under houseless category as houseless grant (@ Rs. 8000) and transportation grant (@ Rs.8000). Due to increase in acquisition of private land, the number of PAFs is 521 nos. The list of land oustees whose 100%, more than 50% or less than 50% land has been acquired, and who are eligible to receive R&R grant was received from the Revenue authorities and payment for the same has been released. Based on the demand of Collector Land Acquisition, an amount of Rs. 3.74 Crore was deposited with the Collector and same was disbursed to Land Oustees as R&R Grant which also includes expenditure under Houseless Grant.
- 2. <u>Fisheries Development:</u> The project had disbursed Rs.100.00 lakh to Commissioner Secretary, Forests & Fisheries to start the plan. The project has handed over the land for

the Fish farm to the Fisheries department and also provided a small house for establishment of Office at the site. Utilization certification for Rs.90.70 lakhs has been received till date and utilization of balance Rs. 9.30 lakhs is still awaited from J & K Fisheries Department.

- 3. <u>Sewage & Solid waste disposal</u>: For sewage disposal, septic tanks with soak pits have been provided in all the colonies. Dustbins have been provided in colonies / camps, and for collection and safe disposal of solid wastes. Biomedical and food waste are disposed safely in separate pits constructed for this purpose. Sewage Treatment Plant (STP) of 5KLD capacity has been installed at power house.
- 4. <u>Green Belt Development:</u> The project had assigned the work of Rim Reservoir Treatment & Creation of Green belt around Reservoir to State Soil Conservation department. The department had submitted the revised proposal for tune of Rs.107.60 Lakh. The State Soil Conservation Department has completed the civil, plantation and fencing works and utilization certificate for Rs.101.88 lakh has been received.
