The balance 50% amount of compensation will be disbursed to 03 nos. of PAFs subject to dismantling of their home shed. 02 PAF's out of 05 PAFs who received 50% amount have vacated & dismantled their houses for which their balance 50% payment is under process. 02 PAF has submitted the documents & affidavit for acceptance of compensation for which full & final compensation payment is under verification. As such, out of 84 nos. of PAFs, 79 have received full compensation, 03 have received 50
