

In reference to above subject, a site visit of officials of State Fisheries Department was held at Project Office, Sikkip on 26.06.2024 for finalizing estimate of Fish Management Plan of the Project.

During the meeting, following issues were discussed on aforesaid matter -

 Water Availability Study- Water availability provisions in DPR may be elaborated to ensure all time availability at the proposed hatchery site.

2. Layouts: All drawings and layout of Fish hatchery may be added in DPR to commensurate with the land indicated for same.

3. Estimate- All required dimensions in drawings of DPR may be elaborated to concur with figures in estimate.

4. Payment Plan: Payment plan of DPR may be divided into installments.

In view of the above, it is requested that above provisions in existing DPR of Fish Management Plan of Project may be included in order to execution of same at the earliest.

Nonetheless, a Fish hatchery through Central Government assistance under "Pradhan Mantri Matasya Sampada Yojna" is being developed by the State Fisheries Department at Rohtak Nallah. The site is just adjacent to boundary of Power House site of the Project. Therefore, it is proposed that an alternate/additional component at Rohtak site may also be explored to cater the needs of Fish Management under EMP of the Project.
